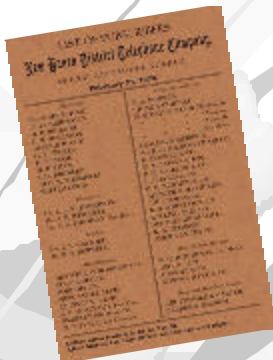
RATE YOUR MAINTENANCE :
